## Bringing People Together Fund – Grant Conditions

Derbyshire County Council retains the right to reclaim, at any time, all or part of the awarded money if it is not spent for the purpose it was granted.

Derbyshire County Council retains the right at any time to reclaim any asset purchased from the awarded money which is no longer being used for the purpose it was granted.

The organisation must inform the County Council immediately if it is unable to accept or comply with any of the following conditions:

- Funding from the Bringing People Together Fund will be used for the specific purpose for which it is granted.
- No asset purchased from the awarded money will be sold or transferred without the prior agreement of the County Council.
- The support will be recognised as a 'one off' award and does not imply a County Council commitment to any future funding.
